A history of St. Marys

The Town of St. Marys acknowledges that it is located on the traditional territory of the Haudenosaunee, Anishinaabe, and Ojibway/Chippewa peoples. This area is within the boundaries covered by Treaty 29, known as the Huron Tract Purchase, and is protected by the Dish With One Spoon wampum agreement. Today, many Indigenous peoples continue to call this land home and act as its stewards, and we are grateful to have the opportunity to live and work on this territory.

The first European settlers arrived in St. Marys in the early 1840s, attracted by the area's natural resources. At the new town site, the Thames River cascaded over a series of limestone ledges, providing the power to run the first pioneer mills.


In the riverbed and along the banks, limestone was close to the surface and could be quarried for building materials. Many 19th century limestone structures survive: churches, commercial blocks, and private homes. They have given St. Marys its current nickname: Stonetown.

The coming of the Grand Trunk Railway in the late 1850s spurred growth and soon St. Marys became a centre for milling, grain-trading, and the manufacture of agriculture-related products. The railway connected the town to the rest of the world and framed the local landscape with its two large trestle bridges on limestone pillars across the waterways.


In the late 1800s as the town prospered, social, educational, and cultural facilities expanded. The established churches built beautiful new places of worship, their steeples visible for kilometers around the countryside. The Opera House opened in 1880. A new Town Hall was built in 1891 and a beautiful Carnegie Library in 1904.

St. Marys today retains its 19th century flavour while offering all the attractions of a modern and friendly small town. In the downtown area, the streets are flanked with century-old buildings. Although the old mills have vanished, a community walkway follows the old millrace along the river. Limestone is no longer quarried for building blocks but it is still an essential to production at the St. Marys Cement Company, a major local industry. A limestone quarry abandoned in 1930 is now a municipal swimming facility.

St. Marys residents are proud of their community's heritage and look confidently to the future.

Broken Rail Brewing was established with the goal to keep this historic station and story alive - and why not make some damn good beer while we are at it!











Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame & Museum

The Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame & Museum is one of the "must sees" of Canada. Newly renovated and expanded, the 3500 sq ft museum is nestled on a picturesque 32-acre site that overlooks the Quarry and includes a major league style baseball diamond, three youth fields, and walking trails. The home of Canada's rich baseball history, the Hall of Fame showcases artifacts and memorabilia that pay tribute to baseball's Canadian roots and the accomplishments of its 155 inductees. In 2022 we hosted hundreds of events on the five fields we maintain.

The Hall's 25th annual Celebrity Golf Classic and banquet will take place at the St. Marys Golf & Country Club. Offering three delicious meals, a great gift package and a chance to win fabulous prizes, it promises to be an unforgettable event. Celebrities such as inductees Jesse Barfield, Rich Harden, Denis Boucher, John Olerud and Jacques Doucet, plus past inductees Justin Morneau, Duane Ward, Larry Walker, Fergie Jenkins, Steve Rogers Tom Henke, Ernie Whitt and former MLB players Paul Spoljaric, Billy Atkinson and Larry Landreth, plus former Team Canada player Brock Kjeldgaard and former NHL players Dennis Maruk, Mark Bell, Walter Tkaczuk and Merlin Malinowski.

Induction Day - June 17

The Induction ceremony will take place on the Hall of Fame grounds for Canadian Rich Harden, former Toronto Blue Jays player Jesse Barfield and former player and current Scout and Team Canada Coach Denis Boucher and baseball executive Joe Wiwchar. An autograph session with this year's inductees and other celebrities will take place after the ceremony. Special guests include Fergie Jenkins, Pat Gillick, Paul Beeston, Steve Rogers and others. Arrive early because taking place throughout the day will be ballgames, silent auction, museum tours, BBQ and beer tent.



2023 Inductees

Jesse Barfield played 9 years with the Toronto Blue Jays from 1981-89. In total, Barfield played 1,032 games and ranks in the club's all-time top 10 in several statistical categories, including fourth in WAR (29.5), seventh in home runs (179) and ninth in total bases (1,672) and RBIs (527). He is widely considered to have one of the best outfield throwing arms in MLB history.

Denis Boucher was born in Montreal, Quebec and pitched 10 years of professional baseball including with the Blue Jays and Expos from 1988-97. Following his playing career, Boucher joined the national team as a pitching coach for such tournaments as the Olympics, the World Baseball Classics and the Pan Am Games. He has also developed into a highly respected scout, first with the Washington Nationals from 2004 to 2009 and with the New York Yankees, from 2009 to present.

Rich Harden was born in Victoria, British Columbia and pitched 9 years in Major League Baseball from 2003-2011 with Oakland, Minnesota, Chicago and Texas. In all, Harden had a 59-38 record and a 3.76 ERA in 170 appearances. His 949 strikeouts and 17.9 WAR rank sixth all-time among Canadian big league pitchers, while his 160 starts ranked 10th among Canucks. He also retired as one of four Canadian major league pitchers to have averaged more than a strikeout per inning (minimum 100 innings).

Joe Wiwchar was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba and has devoted seven decades to baseball in his home province, as a player, coach, volunteer, executive and administrator. He is best known for his long and successful coaching career, which spanned from 1953 to 2013. In 1998, he became the first administrative manager of the Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame, a position he held until 2022.

Our new museum space is perfect for small gatherings for up to 55 people for your organization, group or service club and can include group museum tours.

How about a day at the Hall of Fame? Play a ballgame, have a BBQ, tour the museum and in July/August add a swim in the famous quarry.

Make the best of your day and escape to St. Marys, where history meets modern adventure. Whether you're admiring the architecture of the town's heritage and historic landmarks, or making a splash at the St. Marys Quarry, there's always something to discover when you visit St. Marys!

Arts & Culture

- 1. Visit St. Marys Station Gallery located within the St. Marys Train Station.
- 2. Step into an artist's world with a guided tour at the Art of Ideas Gallery.
- 3. Look at the beautiful local art creations showcased by Stonetown Arts.
- 4. Explore extraordinary exhibits and materials at the St. Marys Museum and learn about the local history that shaped St. Marys.
- 5. Discover the roots of baseball at the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Marvel at the unique architecture of the historic downtown featuring locally quarried limestone.
- Stop by what is believed to be the oldest fish ladder in Ontario constructed in 1908.

- 1. Watch the St. Marys Community Players take the stage with a local theatre production.
- 2. Browse your favourite books and board games at the St. Marys Public Library.

- 2. Discover our trail system that offers both leisurely strolls and more active pursuits. Be sure not to miss the most prized view atop the Grand Trunk Trail overlooking the Thames River and historical downtown.
- 3. Get creative and learn at the St. Marys Museum. In addition to 10 historical exhibits, there is also an interactive children's discovery area!
- 4. Pop into the St. Marys Library to find a new book, enjoy regular kids

programming or get creative in the Makerspace! The library also offers several incredible rentals for outdoor enthusiasts: kayaks, fishing poles, birdwatching kits, and snowshoe rentals.

Bring your scooter, bike, skateboard, or roller blades to the Rotary All Wheels Park.

- Make time to sit and enjoy a bite to eat or drinks at one of our restaurants, pubs, and brewery.
- 2. If you're looking for something lighter, grab a quick coffee or a sweet treat from one of the cafés or specialty food shops.
- 3. Explore the charming boutiques and shops of our historic downtown, lined with limestone heritage buildings, each with a fascinating story.
- 4. With many takeaway options, choose to order to-go and enjoy your meal as a picnic in one of our many beautiful parks.
- 5. Relax and restore with an array of self-care services: nailcare, haircare, yoga, massage, reiki, and more.
- 6. Sample and enjoy local food at the St. Marys Farmers' Market, open seasonally on Saturday mornings.













St. Marys and area offers three unique, picturesque and challenging golf courses to intrique players of all abilities.

The St. Marys Golf & Country Club, founded in 1931, is a par-72 that stretches out to 6,567 yards from the back tees. "Located along the beautiful Thames River, the course prides itself on its spectacular views highlighted by incredible rolling hills, natural creeks and mature trees. The challenging, yet forgiving, course layout welcomes all types of players, from beginners to avid golfers," says Brandon De Groote, Director of Golf Operations. The Club also offers a first-class restaurant, Social Thirty-One, and an inviting patio. Weddings are often held on the picturesque grounds with receptions in one of the facilities' banquet halls.

Science Hill Country Club, opened in 1976, and remains one of Southwestern Ontario's best-kept secrets. Located in the countryside just a few minutes northwest of St. Marys on Road 137, Science Hill is a par-70

course measuring 5,900 yards from the tips. This year, after 35 years, the course is under new ownership (Southside Group of London) and with them have come many changes, including Taps On The Thames restaurant being the latest update to the clubhouse. From lunch, casual dining, live entertainment on the patio, or special occasion bookings, Taps has it all. Call for reservations or come in and enjoy one of the nicest patios in the area.

Just a short drive from St. Marys, River Valley Golf & Country Club is located on a very scenic and undulating parcel of land which is popular for all seasons – in the warm months as a golf course and in the winter months as a tube slide venue. Co-owner/operator David Tkachuk says of the par-65, 4,734 yard course, "The rolling hills and valleys offer beautiful views of the surrounding landscape. The golf course has lots of elevation that will challenge all playing levels." River Valley has a new Grand Hall for banquets, a restaurant, and spacious outdoor deck area.

St. Marys Museum and Archives

The community museum for the Town of St. Marys is located at 177 Church Street South in Cadzow Park. The limestone house was built in 1854 for George Tracy, one of the area's earliest settlers. At the time it was built it was by far the largest home in the small village of log shanties, and almost immediately was nicknamed the "Castle in the Bush." It has been the location of the St. Marys Museum since 1959.

Visitors interested in 19th century construction are welcome to visit at any time throughout the year, not just during special events. They will see exhibits and materials on local history and can also explore the interior of the house itself. Although it has not been restored to any fixed historic period, it contains a great number of original features from 1854: pine flooring, four fireplaces, plaster crown mouldings and other plaster decorations, high ceilings and strange sets of small rooms off larger chambers.

There are two outbuildings beside the main Museum house, which are open seasonally. One is a re-creation of a woodworking shop. The other outbuilding is a barn full of machinery and tools.

It has a collection of implements manufactured by Maxwell's Limited, a company that began operations in St. Marys in 1888. Maxwell's made a full line of farm machinery and smaller pieces such as lawn mowers, churns, washing machines and cider presses. The barn also contains a traditional horse-drawn buggy, a St. Marysmade sleigh and a 1902 Baker Electric car that was owned and operated locally.

This community museum has ten display areas open to the public, all containing artifacts associated with the history of this area. Throughout the year, there is a schedule of changing exhibits and activities, based on the collection. There is always something new to see!

Our spring exhibits include:

- Community Players, Open March 13
- Artists of St. Marys, Open April 18

Our summer/fall special events and programs:

On July 1, celebrate Canada's 156th birthday at the Canada Day celebration held



in Cadzow Park. While enjoying the festivities in the park, venture up to the Museum to enjoy free admission, special exhibits, and family activities.

On Saturday, July 15, join a Museum volunteer for a guided heritage tour of St. Marys, as part of the Stonetown Heritage Festival! These free tours depart hourly from Town Hall. Pre-register at the event information tent.

The St. Marys Museum hosts the annual **Melodies at the Museum** summer concert series every Wednesday evening in August. From 7 to 8 p.m. a different musical performance takes place outdoors in Cadzow Park. Admission is by donation with all proceeds supporting the St. Marys Museum. Please bring a blanket or lawn chair with you! In inclement weather, the concert will move to the Town Hall auditorium at 175 Queen Street East.

On Saturday, September 23, the St. Marys Museum, along with approximately 15 other heritage buildings in the community, will be opening their doors for **Doors Open St. Marys**. Enjoy this opportunity to tour interesting buildings not always open to the public, free of charge. The event runs from 10am to 4pm. Stop by the information tent at Town Hall (175 Queen Street East) to pick up your guide for the day.

Back by popular demand, the Museum will once again be offering guided heritage kayak tours in 2023. Enjoy some fresh air and exercise while taking in the heritage sites of St. Marys from a whole new perspective along the Thames River and Trout Creek. Pre-registration is required. Contact the Museum or follow us on Facebook for tour dates and times.

The St. Marys Museum is open year-round Monday to Friday, 9:00 to 4:00. Also open 12:00 to 4:00 on Saturdays and Sundays in June, July and August. Admission is by donation. The archives is open by appointment. Although the Museum's address is 177 Church Street South, it is easiest for visitors to use the parking lot behind the main building, reached by a laneway from Tracy Street on the east side of Cadzow Park. Destination: St. Marys Public Library

On your next adventure, leave the ordinary behind and experience the unlimited fun offered by the St. Marys Public Library (15 Church St. N.). The library has three free loan programs designed to help you discover the best of St. Marys. From paddling the Thames River and Trout Creek by kayak, to snowshoeing through a winter wonderland, they've got you covered. And get this: you don't need a library card to participate! You can experience all the fun inside the library and beyond its doors no matter what time of year you visit!

Paradise is a paddle away

Discover the Thames River and Trout Creek using the free kayak loan program, the Yak Shack! Explore approximately five kilometres on the water while you marvel at views of the Sarnia Bridge, St. Marys' historic downtown and the surrounding countryside. You may even spot some wildlife while you enjoy a peaceful paddle!

Borrowing a kayak is easy:

- Reserve a kayak online through ActiveNet.
- Pick up your paddle, safety gear and key at the library
- Unlock your kayak at the Yak Shack located at the north end of Milt Dunnell Field (1 Veterans Circle).
- Get paddling!
- Properly secure your kayak back on the Yak Shack and return your paddle, safety gear and key to the library.







Shopping in St. Marys

Whether you're hunting for the perfect souvenir, gift, treat or necessity, you are certain to find it in our historically charming yet thoroughly modern downtown.

Plentiful free parking will make your browse a breeze: park on-street for three hours or for longer in one of many nearby municipal lots.

Queen Street, St. Marys' main thoroughfare, has long showcased the lion's share of shopping and services. There's a focus on established local makers, whether it's candles at Stone Home Creatives, chocolates at The Chocolate Factory, small-batch coffee beans at Snapping Turtle and fresh-baked donuts at Green Haven Bakery. You'll also find clothing for the entire family, home goods and an array of services.

More permanent local pleasures can be sought at Zenfire Pottery, which also boasts a pottery studio, and at Little Falls Crafters Market. Visit Sun Rayz for a wearable reminder of your visit, via a fully customizable tank, tee or hoodie with a selection of local logos. On weekends, area fine artists host "The Studio" above the Flower Shop and More, a show and sale of original works.

Recently, Water Street south of Queen has undergone a



retail renaissance thanks in part to the incredible restoration of a stately limestone block at the intersection's corner. The building now houses The Flour Mill, a destination food shop; Betty's Bookshop, a sweetly tiny yet well-stocked bookstore; and Miss Jones cannabis dispensary. Across the street, Cloud 9 Kids provides parental relief with preloved children's clothing and footwear plus new and nearly new books, toys and gifts.

Keeping with the preloved theme, treasure hunters will delight in Pass It On and the local Salvation Army further down Water Street. Head back to Queen Street to continue your preloved journey at Eclectic Treasures. Just north of Queen, bargain hunters will enjoy the thrill of the chase at Jacobs Liquidation.

Dotted throughout the downtown are a variety of cafes for a quick treat or light meal. Looking for something more substantial? The chef-driven TuttCo on Queen Street serves creatively delicious lunch and supper with a focus on sustainability while O'Leary's Creamery offers pub and Mexican fare with a scenic patio. New to Water Street is Gilly's Pubhouse, a family-friendly eatery with extended hours.
